Bond Market Review

November 3, 2025

Summary

Treasury yields were under pressure last week after the Federal Reserve (Fed) cut the fed funds rate by 25 basis points but in the Q&A session, Chairman Jerome Powell emphasized that an additional cut in December is not a foregone conclusion. The market quickly reduced expectations for future rate cuts with the 10-year Treasury yield rising to approximately 4.10%. Without several key economic data releases due to the government shutdown and concerns of more tariff-driven inflation in the pipeline, the Fed opted to proceed more slowly than the market was anticipating.

Credit Lags on Supply Concerns

• Investment grade credit decoupled from most other asset classes last week as a large increase in supply, mostly by Meta Platforms, caught investors off-balance. Meta printed a \$30B new issue Thursday with initial price guidance almost 50 bps wide of existing bonds. Although the final print was well inside guidance, at 10-15 bps of concession it re-priced their bonds wider and negatively impacted the telecommunications sector.

High Yield Weakens

 High yield corporates felt better for most of the week in our view, continuing to recover from the modest widening in mid-October, however, investor sentiment deteriorated after Powell threw shade on prospects for another rate cut in December.
 Spreads for the ICE BofA U.S. High Yield Master II Index closed the week 6 bps wider after widening 9 bps on Friday.

Munis Outperform Treasuries

 Municipal bonds outperformed Treasuries after the tax-exempt yields were only modestly higher following the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) meeting. The curve continued its flattening trend with the 1-5 year inversion reaching -18 bps. Muni-to-Treasury ratios tightened on the strength to 64% in 5-years, 67% in 10-years, and 89% in 30-years.

Santee Cooper Nuclear Plant Renewed Interest

Santee Cooper signed a letter of intent (LOI) with Brookfield Asset Management to take over completion of Summer nuclear units #2 and #3. The LOI establishes a six-week project feasibility period where the parties will jointly select a project manager and evaluate construction providers. There is no guarantee that the memorandum will be executed or that the nuclear units will be completed but it could be credit positive for Santee Cooper.

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Technical Terms: Duration: a tool used in assessing the price volatility of a fixed-income security. Gross Domestic Product (GDP) A comprehensive measure of U.S. economic activity. GDP measures the value of the final goods and services produced in the United States (without double counting the intermediate goods and services used up to produce them). The federal funds rate is the interest rate at which depository institutions (mainly banks) lend reserve balances to other depository institutions overnight on an uncollateralized basis. In simpler terms, it's the rate banks charge each other for short-term loans to meet their reserve requirements. Municipal/Treasury Ratio: a comparison of the current yield of municipal bonds to U.S. Treasuries. Non-farm payroll refers to the number of jobs in the private sector and government agencies. It excludes farm workers, private household employees, proprietors, non-profit employees, and actively serving military. Option-Adjusted Spread (OAS) is the measurement of the spread of a fixed-income security rate and the risk-free rate of return, which is then adjusted to take into account an embedded option. Typically, an analyst uses Treasury yields for the risk-free rate. The spread is added to the fixed-income security price to make the risk-free bond price the same as the bond. Personal consumption expenditures (PCE) is the primary measure of consumer spending on goods and services in the U.S. economy. Tax-Equivalent Spread is the spread needed on a taxable bond to produce the same yield as a municipal bond. Tax-Equivalent Yield: the return that is required on a taxable investment to make it equal to the return on a tax-exempt investment. Yield Spread: the difference between the quoted rates of return between two different investment vehicles; also called the credit spread. Yield-To-Worst: Is a measure of the lowest possible yield that can be received on a bond that fully operates within the terms of its contract without defaulting. It is a type of yield that is referenced wh
