Bond Market Review

July 28, 2025

Summary

The macro calendar contains several key economic data releases this week including Q2 Gross Domestic Product (GDP), Core Personal Consumption Expenditure (PCE), and the July Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) meeting. Market participants will attempt to gain clarity on how tariffs are impacting growth, inflation, and monetary policy decisions. The Federal Reserve's statement will be dissected for any hint of dovishness given the recent pressure applied by President Trump.

Summer Grind With a Few Surprises

Earnings season brought a few negative surprises with names like Charter Communications and Intel while potential consolidation in the railroad sector also resulted in some underperformance. Overall, investment grade corporate spreads were flat and fully in summer grind mode. Charter's spreads were three-five bps wider Friday after posting higher broadband customer losses than expected. Intel was five-seven basis points wider as their earnings report showed minimal progress on their turnaround.

High Yield Corporates Rally with Equities

• The high yield market posted excess return of 0.32% last week in what was a relatively quiet week for macro news. Stocks trading to new highs were part of the story as risk generally continues to be in favor, with investors seemingly looking through near-term tariff volatility. Spreads were nine bps tighter on the week and are 14 bps tighter in July, trading in the second 10-year percentile with the option-adjusted spread at 282 bps.

Munis Stabilize After Underperforming

• The Muni market found firmer footing last week after buyers emerged for long-term bonds trading near five percent. The improved demand for this segment seemed to translate to better sentiment in general, in our view, leading to a slight reversal of last week's bear steepening. Municipal-to-Treasury ratios closed the week at 65% in five-years, 76% in 10 -years, and 96% in 30-years.

Sales Tax Holidays Reduce Revenue

Sales tax holidays in 18 states will reduce their revenue by a collective \$1.3B in 2025, according to a recent study by the Institute on Taxation and Economic Policy. The states are on the hook for lost sales taxes from items like school supplies, energy-efficient appliances, and emergency supplies, with E11 states having tax holidays for back-to-school shopping.

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Technical Terms: Duration: a tool used in assessing the price volatility of a fixed-income security. Gross Domestic Product (GDP) A comprehensive measure of U.S. economic activity. GDP measures the value of the final goods and services produced in the United States (without double counting the intermediate goods and services used up to produce them). The federal funds rate is the interest rate at which depository institutions (mainly banks) lend reserve balances to other depository institutions overnight on an uncollateralized basis. In simpler terms, it's the rate banks charge each other for short-term loans to meet their reserve requirements. Municipal/Treasury Ratio: a comparison of the current yield of municipal bonds to U.S. Treasuries. Non-farm payroll refers to the number of jobs in the private sector and government agencies. It excludes farm workers, private household employees, proprietors, non-profit employees, and actively serving military. Option-Adjusted Spread (OAS) is the measurement of the spread of a fixed-income security rate and the risk-free rate of return, which is then adjusted to take into account an embedded option. Typically, an analyst uses Treasury yields for the risk-free rate. The spread is added to the fixed-income security price to make the risk-free bond price the same as the bond. Personal consumption expenditures (PCE) is the primary measure of consumer spending on goods and services in the U.S. economy. Tax-Equivalent Spread is the spread needed on a taxable bond to produce the same yield as a municipal bond. Tax-Equivalent Yield: the return that is required on a taxable investment to make it equal to the return on a tax-exempt investment. Yield Spread: the difference between the quoted rates of return between two different investment vehicles; also called the credit spread. Yield-To-Worst: Is a measure of the lowest possible yield that can be received on a bond that fully operates within the terms of its contract without defaulting. It is a type of yield that is referenced wh
