The securities in these portfolios consist of government related securities, investment grade corporate and securitized instruments and have an average credit rating of "AA."

Sterling manages a variety of equity, fixed income and balanced assets. Prior to January 2001, Sterling was a wholly owned subsidiary of United Asset Management (UAM). In January 2001, Sterling Capital Management LLC purchased all the assets and business of Sterling Capital Management Company from UAM to become an employee owned firm. In April 2005, BB&T Corporation purchased a majority equity ownership stake in Sterling Capital Management LLC. In October 2010, the management group of Sterling Capital entered into an agreement with BB&T Corporation that reduced and restructured management's interest in Sterling Capital Management. Additionally, BB&T Asset Management merged into Sterling Capital Management. In January 2013, CHOICE Asset Management merged into Sterling Capital Management. In August 2015, eight new employees joined Sterling Capital Management via Stratton Management Company following the close of BB&T's purchase of Susquehanna Bancshares. In December 2019, BB&T Corporation and SunTrust Banks, Inc. Holding Company merged as equals to form Truist Financial Corporation. Sterling Capital Management LLC is a wholly owned subsidiary of Truist Financial Corporation. In August 2020, new employees joined Sterling Capital Management via the Investment Advisory Group of SunTrust Advisory Services. This reorganization aligns all of the discretionary fixed income asset management activities within Truist under Sterling.

- Performance reflects reinvested interest income and dividends and realized and unrealized capital gains and losses. All portfolios utilize trade-date and accrued income accounting. Valuations and performance are reported in U.S. dollars. Periodic time weighted returns are geometrically linked. Returns are not calculated net of non-reclaimable withholding taxes due to immaterial dollar amounts. Effective 1/1/22, composite returns are calculated by weighting the individual portfolio returns using beginning of period market values. From 4/30/99 through 12/31/21, composite returns were asset weighted using the aggregate method that reflects both beginning market value and cash flows. Prior to 4/30/99, composite returns were calculated by weighting the individual portfolio returns using beginning of period market values.
- Gross of fees returns are presented before management fees but after all trading costs. Effective 1/1/22, the net of fees returns reflect the maximum ADV management fee. Prior to 1/1/22, net of fees returns are presented after actual management fees and trading costs. The stated fee schedule is: 0.15% on the first \$100 million, 0.125% on the next \$100 million, and 0.10% on all incremental assets above \$200 million on an annual basis as described in Sterling Capital Management's Form ADV, Part 2.
- Prior to 12/31/14, the composite description included the following: Maximum final maturity of 5 years. The securities in these portfolios consist of U.S. Governments, investment grade corporate, asset-backed securities, mortgage backed securities and municipals. Effective 6/30/20, the appropriate benchmark was changed retroactively to inception from the ICE BofA 1-3 Year Government Bond Index to the ICE BofA 1-3 Year Corp/Govt Bond Index. This index includes fixed rate debt issues rated investment grade or higher by Moody's and S&P. All issues have at least one year to three years to maturity and an outstanding par value of at least \$300 million. All returns are market value weighted inclusive of accrued interest. The total return includes price appreciation/depreciation and income as a percentage of the original investment. The total return index is rebalanced monthly by market capitalization.
- The annual composite dispersion presented is measured by an asset-weighted standard deviation calculation method of all portfolios in the composite for the entire year, and is calculated using gross of fee returns. It is not meaningful when there have been less than six portfolios in composite for entire calendar year. The three year annualized standard deviation measures the variability of the composite and benchmark returns over the preceding 36-month period. The composite 3-year standard deviation is calculated using gross of fee returns. It is not required to be presented when a full three years of composite performance is not yet available.
